From the President's Pen


Happy New Year!

to visit and see what we are working on. Knowledge is always willingly shared. We were all beginners at one time.

"Wool or Handwork" Group was started by me, Pat Adams, because I have a passion for wool! I love the look of applique but found that working with cotton applique was not for me. Then I learned how to appliqué with wool and the rest is history! It started out in my home and also moved to Always in Stitches. It is ALWAYS on the last Tuesday of the month from 1-4 PM. Usually 6-8 participants show up. It has evolved into the "Wool or/Handwork group" because some people prefer to embroider or a bind a quilt instead of working with wool.

"Block of the Month" (BOM) was started by Judy Dunigan in 2012 and it continues to change and adapt to the preferences of those interested in participating. This year we will continue the month by month Block of the Month. There are three committee members (Debbie Cobb, Ellen Hanson, and Kathy Rudd). Each month a block pattern will be presented by one of them. Printed instructions will be handed out at the meeting and links to the pattern or the pattern will be provided in the newsletter and on the website. Members may participate every month, or less often. If they bring a block or two and want a chance to take all the blocks home, they drop their name in the basket for each block they brought, for a drawing. We have had as few as 11 and as many as 30 participants!

Joanne Fishburn started "**Quilting 101**". She knew many of the new members were beginner quilters and needed help getting started. It was more of a structured hands-on class, starting with the basics. She taught it for two years. It is not currently scheduled this year. If you are interested, let me know. About 10 people participated each year.

The "**Library**" Group gathers at the Fishers Library after our monthly meeting for a sew-in for the afternoon. We bring sewing machines, irons, cutting boards, whatever you want to work on. Usually 10-20 participate. We have not been able to reserve the library after every meeting this year, so the location my change but it will be in the newsletter. (We can't bring our machines to the normal meeting location because the electrical system cannot accommodate our needs.)

The "Lunch" Group was started because after the meeting we were HUNGRY! Going to "Play" at the library for the afternoon would require nourishment! So it started with brown bag lunches, then picking up something to eat, then a few people were just going to McAlister's or the Nickel Plate etc. Then before long, it actually became a "thing". Unfortunately, the guild did not realize it was a Guild "thing" and the word did not really get out there and some people may have been left out. Therefore, we are going to get the word out about where people are going for lunch. So please leave your nametags on if you do this so our new members can find our group.

A great way to get to know people and feel like you really belong is to check out our "Groups". If you do not see one that you are interested in, maybe it is time to start another one! Maybe one for paper-piecing, hexys, machine embroidery, hand quilting or a Round Robin! If you are interested let me know and we'll help get one started.

I loved the "name" game at the Christmas Party. I had about 100 names correct, that's 50 ladies! I know those Quilting divas through being a member of the board or on committees or in groups together. It is just about impossible to get to know anyone at the meetings because there is not enough time to socialize. I encourage you to check out a group or join a committee. More groups equal more interaction, which equals more quilting ideas and friendships.
