BROCCOLI SALAD - Nancy McDonald

4-5 cups broccoli flowerettes
1/2 red onion, sliced
1/2 cup cheddar cheese, grated
1/2 lb. bacon, fried and chopped
Dressing (below)

Preparation: Combine all ingredients except dressing.

For dressing, combine 1 cup Miracle whip (no substitutions), 2 Tablespoons white vinegar, and 6 Tablespoons sugar.

 packages flavored Ramen noodles (I use one oriental and one beef, can use two beef.)

Mix above in large bowl, crumbling dry noodles into tiny pieces.

Dressing: 1 cup salad oil ¹/₂ cup sugar 1/3 cup white vinegar Flavor packets from Ramen noodles

Mix or shake in jar and add to coleslaw mixture just before serving.
