Block of the Month

Each month a pattern and color scheme will be provided and ANYONE who wants to participate will have a chance to take home all the blocks! You can bring blocks any month, no advance sign up is required. Please pin your name on your block and place it on the design wall when you arrive at the meeting. We will use this pinned note for the drawing to determine the winner of **ALL** the blocks.

BOM can now be found listed on our website! Check anytime you want to know what is coming up.

March Block will be a simple flower made up of 4 - 5.5 inch floral patterned fabric squares (Think Spring!); 3 - 2 inch white or cream colored squares, marked diagonally, and sewn on three of the corners; 1 - 2.5 inch yellowish square, also marked diagonally, will be added to the other corner of each piece. When the four pieces are trimmed, pressed and sewn together, they will create a flower with a yellow center. The block should measure 10.5 inches. Do not forget to pin your name on it.

91 Quilts Donated To the Riley Children's Hospital!

On Friday, February 13th we donated an astounding 91 quilts/crocheted blankets and 11 pillowcases to the Cheer Guild at Riley Children's Hospital. Heather Dawes, the director of the organization, met me with open arms and a very large rolling cart! She began pulling out some of the bright cheerful quilts and was in awe of Mudsock's charitable and beautiful donations.

Each month I am overwhelmed with the donations and support you ladies continue to give this charity which began 3 years ago. This year it added up to 102 items! The quilts have come from members of he guild as well as my mom, an avid quilter in Massachusetts (thanks mom!). The quilts will be considered "keepsake items" and will be given with discernment to families in need. From my experience, those items are among the most precious that a family going through tragedy will receive.

The Mudsock Quilters Guild continues to set the bar high and reach it. Take a look at these numbers:

February 2013 (first year for the charity): 21 quilts donated. February 2014: 43 quilts/crocheted blankets donated. February 2015: 91 quilts/crocheted blankets, 11 pillowcases donated.

Do you see the trend? Each year we have more than doubled the number from the year before! That makes me wonder...what will 2016 yield?
