With this summer heat wave you can find me in my sewing room --finally. I am sorting through my huge stash of fabric, patterns and tools trying to thin out the duplicates," WWIT's" (What Was I Thinking) and the" Been There Done That" collection. I have a bag to toss them into for our September Yard Sale out back at Always In Stitches. It will be on Saturday, September 14. Bring your donations to our September 9 Mudsock meeting.



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I am also busy finishing two quilts. I have machine sewed the bindings to the quilts and look forward to some quiet time hand sewing the folded edge down. I always enjoy this final step since I get to study my quilt bit by bit as I go around the whole piece. This time I made my binding and used "The Binding Tool" from TQM Products to make the final joint meet perfectly on the diagonal. I think there are some gaps in the directions, but I did make it work on both quilts. I purchased it at Quilt Expressions – so glad to be able to run over and find one there.

My final step with both of these projects is to make hanging sleeves and labels. I plan to piece together a fabric strip from the fabrics used in the quilt. It is both necessary and fun. There doesn't seem to be enough of any one fabric to make the sleeve and, well, muslin is so boring! A week or so ago I went to the August Piecing Group meeting at Always In Stitches. We had our own room and a wonderful afternoon of sewing, visiting and making new acquaintances. We were even given our own little goody bags! And let's not forget it was a chance to look around at all the wonderful fabric out in the showroom. I'm looking forward to more sewing time as this heat continues. I need to prioritize since I have about a dozen projects calling to me. I am going to try to finish a UFO before I start anything new. Do you think my Nook Covers count as a UFO? They have been on my list since last Fall and I've bought the fusibles but never cut anything out! I guess a little soul searching will be called for on them.
