A Quilter's Challenge

Quilters love challenges! Quilters love meaningful challenges even more. I'm hoping our wonderful guild will rise to the challenge I presented 9 months ago. In January, I presented a challenge to the guild to complete 50 quilts and/or blankets (details below) for donation to Riley Children's Hospital and the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. I am very passionate about this donation and would like to see my goal reached. For those of you new to the guild, I will share the two precious reasons why I'm so dedicated to see this through.

Twenty three months ago, my husband was offered a position at Eli Lilly. At the time we were living in North Carolina raising our son and pregnant with twins. We planned the move but didn't plan the rest of the story. I went into premature labor and delivered our beautiful son and daughter. We were blessed to have our son for one day and our daughter for three before passing away. Everything they touched in their short life was given to us. I have quilts on which they laid, I have blankets they touched, I have the crocheted caps they wore. Each item is cherished beyond words.

Now you know my two reasons I feel passionately about giving to other families through the hospital. I hope my story touches you and motivates you to create something for a family who is mourning the life of their child, or for a family who is celebrating the endurance of their child.

Requirements of the quilts/blankets:

- Size: suggested sizes are 45X60 or 72X80 (I realize these are large), but smaller will be accepted and appreciated.
- Yarn: for knitted/crocheted blankets, yarn must be new.
- Other: NO TACKING! There is to be no hand sewing whatsoever as this can get caught on IV tubing and other equipment.
- NICU: For items going to the NICU, only 100% cotton is used (cotton batting, cotton fabric, cotton thread, no hand sewing).

I am unable to attend the guild meetings since I am working full time now, but if you give the donated items to Rosie Antonides, I will get them from her. I appreciate all your dedication and hard work! Thank you for making this goal happen!
