

Next Meeting -October 13, 9:30AM - Fishers UMC

Karen Burkett will be showing us a simple ruching technique to form these three flowers and the leaf (seen next page). The orange one (far left) kind of looks like a carnation, the red one (middle) is made the same way only a different center. And the raw edge ones (far right) look like a poppy. She will also demonstrate how to use heat and Bond to form flowers, and how to use texture magic. She also wants to share some hints that have made appliqué easier for her.

If you would like to try your hand at making some of the flowers please bring to the Oct meeting: 1 1/4 inch strip of fabric 18 inches long 2 1/2 inch strip of fabric cut the length of the fabric

3 inch square of fabric in green for a leaf

Small ruler, something to mark on the fabric with (like a sharpie or frixion pen), needle and thread, and small scissors.
