



## Other Quilting Events

**Mar 4-Jan 8, 2017** The Indianapolis Museum of Art presents ***A Joy Forever: Marie Webster Quilts*** as part of Indiana's Bicentennial Celebration. This exhibition celebrates the legacy of Marie Daugherty Webster (1859-1956), who is considered one of the leading designers in the history of early 20<sup>th</sup>-century quilt making. Born and raised in Indiana, Webster designed and made her first appliquéd quilt in 1909. In the following years, her quilts were featured in *Ladies' Home Journal*, which brought her international fame and recognition. The exhibition consists of 25 appliquéd quilts designed and made by Marie Webster, which date from 1909-1930, 13 patterns, and original pages from *Ladies' Home Journal*. Marie Daugherty Webster's scrapbook is also displayed.

**Oct 7-28** New art quilt exhibition at Madam Walker: **It's All About Jazz**. Judy Ireland will have a work in this invitational exhibit celebrating Jazz at the historic Madam Walker Theater in Indianapolis. There is no cost to see the exhibit on the 4<sup>th</sup> floor, and to enjoy the music at the reception on Oct. 7th from 6-9 pm.

## **Mudsock Quilters Guild 2017 Positions to be Filled by Election**

**The President** – shall preside at all meetings of MQG. The President shall appoint the standing committee chairs to serve for one year and shall be an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. After consulting with the Executive Board, The President shall act on minor matters. The outgoing President shall act as an advisor for MQG for one year immediately following the term of office.

**The Vice President** – shall conduct business of the MQG during the absence of the President. The Vice President is responsible for the Programs. If the office of the President becomes vacant, the Vice President shall succeed to the office of President for the remainder of the term of the office.

**The Secretary** – creates and keeps a record of all meetings. The secretary emails meeting minutes to all Board members and shall make available a copy of the meeting minutes to any MQG member who requests them.

**The Treasurer** – shall serve a term of two years. The Treasurer keeps an account of all monies received and makes payments and disbursements. In the event of the Treasurer's inability to act as Treasurer, the President may make payments and disbursements. The Treasurer is responsible for filing tax forms and the annual report for her years in office. The Treasurer posts a financial statement at the general meeting following a Board meeting.

### **Mudsock Committees (Non-elected Positions)**

**Fund Raising** - helps with yard sales collections, accepting the funds for items purchased, bag items up and store items for the next sale. Could propose other fundraisers of their choice; bake sale, white elephant etc.

**Charity** – help people when they arrive with their canned goods, knitted items, and quilts. They could take pictures of donated quilts and help keep track of our donations. Help our new charity quilt project – Community North Hospital.

**Hospitality** – Welcome members and guests; plan a couple of simple parties throughout the year, plan a game or two or whatever suits their fancy. Plan to begin arranging seating (tables as necessary) for the meeting in whatever the meeting requires for that day.

**Social Media/Web Site/Newsletter** – Could take pictures of various events and happenings, accumulate items for the newsletter and provide updated information for the website.

**Membership** – Could take pictures of members to be used for our membership folder in our website, collect annual dues, name tag fees, update membership rosters, and man the sign-in roster at our meetings.

**Block of the Month** – Plan and present a BOM at the monthly meeting, perhaps a charity BOM or a Round Robin.

**Program** – help plan the Guild monthly program, assisting the Vice President. What would you like to see, learn or do at the guild? Help bring in new speakers and programs. Have the microphone and display wall available for guest who request it.

**Sunshine** – this is a new committee. This is an encouraging committee which could send out get well or sympathy cards, letting our members know they are missed and cared about, also let our members know of a member's need.

Within each committee of 4 or 5 people, there could be a chairperson and 3 or 4 others with specific jobs, maybe cross-trained to help in other areas of their committee when needed.

Each committee could meet, have coffee and discuss your committee ideas and then do some stitching.

The board meets four times a year and works together to get ideas and make plans.

We also have stitching groups such as The Piecing Group, The Wool Group, Quilting 101, Library Group, and Community North Quilt group.

One of the greatest benefits of joining a committee or one of our stitching groups is the friendships that are formed.
