

Block of the Month NEWS

Here's the December BOM, presented at the November meeting, <u>Scrappy Mountain Majesties</u>, also from Bonnie Hunter! This one you start with two 8.5" squares, slice, then rearrange, and you end up with a pair of blocks, one left and one right. It's real easy and quick! We're using **Christmas fabrics**, so for the light side (background) use one that's predominantly white; for the darker side (mountain), use one that's medium to dark so there's good contrast. It would make a wonderful table runner or Christmas quilt! Bring both the right and left side blocks.

Pat Osborn was the winner of the beautiful Maple Leaf blocks for the October BOM! Paula Jurgonski won the Crayon Box blocks for the November BOM!
