

It will be fun to see how many different purses there are at the end of the workshop.

March 12th -- Mudsock Quilters Guild Meeting (9:30-11:30+)

The next Mudsock meeting is on March 12th at our usual meeting place at Fishers United Methodist Church, Fellowship Hall. Join us for a demo of the envelope purse that will be the focus of our afternoon workshop. Sandy Metzger will be our presenter. After her demo, the committees will hold their organizational meetings, which were cancelled in January as a result of the bad weather. If you are not yet on a committee, there is still time to join one. It's a great way to get to meet others in the guild.

Our presenter in April will be Connie Lancaster, owner of Quilts Plus. Her topic is UFO Crackdown. That should be good for all of us!

Envelope Purse Workshop (Free)

Doors open at 12:00 noon, workshop starts at 1:00 p.m. Feel free to bring a sack lunch.

Before the workshop – Quilt and bind a square piece of fabric measuring 18"–26", depending upon the size of the purse you want to make.

Materials (in addition to sewing machine, thread, scissors, etc.):

- 1. Quilted and bound **square** measuring 18"–26", depending upon the size of the purse you want to make
- 2. 2-3/4" wide X width of fabric strip for purse strap, or substitute 1-1/4 yard of cord or braid
- 3. 2" X 40" strip of fusible fleece for strap (if you don't have any, I will be bringing a few yards with me that you can use)
- 4. 2 buttons, $1-\frac{1}{4}$ "- $1-\frac{1}{2}$ " in diameter
- 5. 2 matching covered rubber bands (hair ties) (I will bring extras)
- 6. Matching thread, hand sewing needle
- 7. Magnetic snap, Velcro, or other closure (can be added later)

Each participant will select a crayon. The color of that crayon will need to comprise at least 1/3 of the finished project. The theme of the quilt must relate to a star. Participants are encouraged to create a quilt design as literal or as abstract as they choose.

Quilt Requirements:

Quilts must be of an original design.

Quilts must be no smaller than a 20" square and no larger than a 30" square.

To qualify for judging, a quilt must be pieced, quilted, and bound.

Quilts will be judged by member vote at the June 11th guild meeting. We will award 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places.

This month Joanie Riddle will give a class on making a stripy, scrappy quilt that is fast and easy using a paper foundation which she will supply (see picture below).


