## February 11<sup>th</sup> -- Mudsock Quilters Guild Meeting (9:30–11:30+)

Our speaker is Barbara Triscari. The title of her talk is "Artful Adventure." She is a member of SAQA (Studio Art Quilt Associates), Quilt Guild of Indianapolis and Indianapolis Modern Quilt Guild.

Barbara Triscari grew up in Ohio and Fort Wayne, met her husband at Purdue, and then they embarked on their military journey while raising three girls. She moved to the Lebanon area with her family after her husband retired from the military in 2010 after 13 moves: she lived in 9 states and Italy and traveled to five foreign countries. Throughout her travels, photography has been a constant and she has taken over a million photographs.

Barbara is an art quilter who draws from her photography to create innovative quilts. She began to quilt after seeing that photographs could be printed on fabric. She began exploring ways to piece photographic quilts and soon realized the potential of textiles as a medium and delved into art quilting.

Barbara has developed techniques and shares her experiences in magazines and presentations. She prints on leather and other unconventional materials and uses rust in a controlled manner to reproduce aspects of her photographs. She exhibits frequently in quilt shows and art exhibits.

#### **Mudsock Quilters Guild Board Meeting**

The meeting was held on January 9, 2019 at 1:30 pm at the Fishers Library. Attending: Diane Dimpfl, April Sterling, Alice Whitaker, Donna Reimer, Chris Behme, Marion Newell, Tamera O'Dell, Sandy Metzger, Samantha Berry, Diane Lockman and Laura Anderson.

The meeting was called to order by Alice Whitaker. Introductions were made, including position in the Guild. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written. The Treasurer's report was distributed. It indicates a profit of \$4,195 in 2018. Proposed changes will be discussed under new business.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

**Membership**: Marion Newell reported there were 126 members in 2018. At this time, 75 members have paid their 2019 dues.

**Hospitality:** Laura Anderson has sent an email to previous committee members to determine those that want to stay on the committee. She will be looking at the cost of food items and reimbursement issues. She proposed dual mikes for the meetings for ease of reaching people who need to speak. We need to make an effort to meet new people and quiet people.

**Charity**: Diane Dimpfl reported that they delivered quilts to 140 patients on Christmas. That leaves about 90 left. In the future all completed quilts need to be taken to Community even those shown at the meetings. All fabrics need to be in plastic bins by Community Hospital guidelines. No cardboard boxes are allowed. This is already done. A quilt raffle with proceeds earmarked for the charity quilt project was proposed as it is unknown how much financial support from the hospital guideline will be given this year. It was decided buy-in from the membership was needed. It was also proposed and approved after discussion to purchase insurance at \$178/year to cover the charity quilts and supplies. Laura Anderson discussed the deliveries to Damar which are appreciated. The representative from Damar wants to speak to the guild and this may be arranged in the future.

**Tag Sale**: The quest for a new name is on-going. The Board proposed posting on the website for the membership to vote.

**Sunshine**: The committee still does not receive names of people who need cards. They are going to place a basket at the meetings for members to place names.

**BOM:** The committee has the first two months ready. They will be meeting this month.

Facebook: Amy Klodzen will try posts to increase activity.

**Website:** Diane Lockman was asked if there could be a link to former speakers. She indicated this can be done.

**Newsletter**: A deadline is needed for the letter. It is needed by Wednesday and it was proposed that the deadline be set for the 21<sup>st</sup> of each month.

Bus Trip/Retreat: No report at this time.

**Programs**: April Sterling and Chris Behme distributed the Program Schedule and Budget Estimate for 2019. All the months are completed except August and November. They also proposed that notification to drop out needs to be given no later than 2 weeks before a workshop or a substitute found in order to have a refund. Guidelines will need to be developed.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

Budget changes: <u>Advertising</u> increased to \$100 as the flyer will be updated and distributed to the quilt stores. <u>Hospitality</u> increased by \$50 for food costs. <u>Insurance</u> increased to cover the new policy. <u>Website</u> decreased to reflect actual historical costs. <u>Quilt Show</u> budgeted for \$75. <u>Retreat</u> budgeted for \$250. <u>Programs</u> increased to \$3,500 which will include speaker fees, workshops and speaker travel expenses. Tamara will compile the 2019 budget for consideration.

The Fishers Library has asked the Guild to consider beginning quilting classes to be offered to the public. This discussion was tabled for a future meeting.

#### 2019 Workshops

April 8 – Workshop: The Role of Color in Your Quilts, with Weeks Ringle of Modern Quilt Studio, Community Health Pavilion, 146th Street and Cumberland Road, 2-5 p.m. Cost: \$30.



Weeks Ringle and Bill Kerr are professional quiltmakers and co-founders of Modern Quilt Studio, a design studio in Oak Park, Illinois. Having written the first book on modern quilting, Bill and Weeks are pioneers of the Modern Quilt movement. Weeks made her first modern quilt in 1987 to rethink the possibilities of the American quilt as being expressive of the time in which we live. Having sewn since he was 8, Bill began designing and making modern quilts in 1995.

Their work has been featured widely in the national press including: *O:The Oprah Magazine, Time* magazine, *The New York Times, Dwell, American Patchwork & Quilting, Patchwork Tsushin, France Patchwork*, and *Country Living*, among others. Weeks and Bill have taught extensively throughout the U.S., Canada, Japan (classes taught in Japanese), England, and France (classes taught in French). In addition, Weeks has taught two online classes, Designing Modern Quilts on Craftsy and Solids Revolution on iquilt.com. In 2011, Modern Quilt Studio launched the first-ever magazine dedicated exclusively to modern quilting, *Modern Quilts Illustrated*.

When not busy designing and sewing, Weeks writes about craft and creativity on her blog, *Craft Nectar*. When he's not working in the studio, Bill can be found at Dominican University in River Forest, Illinois, where he is Director of the Graphic Design Discipline. He is the former Chair of the Art Department.

#### Workshop details

Develop analytical methods for using color with confidence through individual and group color explorations. You will leave this workshop with a deeper understanding of the role of color in your quilts and with a renewed excitement about quilting.

Student supplies: rotary cutting equipment, a wide assortment of cotton quilting fabric scraps (bring fabrics you love to work with as well as others that have proved challenging to work with; we'll be working with small pieces), notebook or journal, and a glue stick. Skill level: Beginner to advanced

We will not be using sewing machines at this workshop.

**April 9 – All-day Workshop, Rediscovering Your Stash, with Weeks Ringle.** Community North Pavilion, 146th Street and Cumberland Road, 9 a.m.–4 p.m. Cost, \$50.

Gain color confidence and plan creative ways to use your stash in one day! Mix a big dose of color theory with an in-depth discussion of combining patterns and a pinch of working with large-scale fabrics and you'll end up with a plan for projects that you want to make from the fabrics you already have. In addition, you'll have consultations about how to freshen up your stash while learning how to use fabrics that you love but find perplexing. You'll see new possibilities for working with your stash and leave the workshop with beautiful palettes and plans for your next few projects. Bring patterns you love and fabrics you'd like to use or are unsure how to use and you'll be amazed at how you'll be able to pull it all together. Each student will begin work on a project of their choice during class.

Student supplies needed: An open mind and as large an assortment of cotton quilting fabric as you can haul! Try to include different values and hues, small-scale prints, tone-on-tone prints, solids, stripes, batiks, large-scale fabrics, and especially fabrics you love but find challenging to use. Small quantities are fine. You'll also need a sewing machine, rotary cutting equipment, extension cord, thread, seam ripper, notebook or journal, and any supplies you like to have handy when quilting. Skill level: Adventurous beginner to advanced
