HUNTERS STAR BLOCK

*Ispired by Barbara Brockman's block in her Encyclopedia of Pieced Quilt Patterns

You will NEED:

* 3 different colored fabrics- choose medium-medium dark tones, florals, prints, etc.

-Light colors will not have enough contrast with the cream

* 1 Cream on Cream backround fabric.

1. CUT: Color 1

Color 2

Color 3

Cream on Cream Background

(1) 5"square

(2) 3 1/8" sqs.

(2) 3 1/8"sqs.

(1) 5" sq. & (4) 3 1/8" sqs.

2. MAKE 1/2 square triangles (HST):

using (2) 3 1/8" sqs. of color 2 and (2) 3 1/8" Cream Bkgrd sqs., layer RS together, mark, sew and cut as shown to equal (4) HST



- *place color 2 sqs. RS together with background sqs., mark diagonal, sew 1/4" on either side & cut on marked line to equal (4) 1/2 sq. triangles (HST)
- * repeat with color 3 to create (4) different color HST
- * trim all 8 HST to 2 3/4".

 Hint: You may begin with larger than 31/8" sqs. if that is easier for you.

3. ASSEMBLE your 8 HST's into 4-patch blocks A and B using the layout shown.






Trim blocks A and B to 5" ***Blocks are different so pay close attention to the layout. It will make a difference in how the secondary stars show up once all the blocks are assembled.

4. ASSEMBLE your Hunters Star Block:




A Block 4-patch is sewn to the RIGHT of a Color 1 5" sq.




B Block 4-patch is sewn to the LEFT of a Cream/Cream Background 5" sq.

* Sew the two units together.

trim your block to 9 1/2" and Voile', your block is done!



Page 2 Just Information



There are several different ways to make this block. Pinterest has several examples. I took Barbara Brackman's block for ispiration and broke it down but again many of my method can be found onlie as well as other methods.

*Monday Morning Designs uses the method I used with 4-patches...

The block can be made in a 2-color method or as we are doing - a 3-color scrap. A good stash buster!!

I made 12-15 blocks quickly while making samples. Assemble several and sew a small quuilt or 1 at a time when you get a chance and before you know it you'll have a quilt.

....Or enter a couple in the Block of the Month drawing and you may be a winner!! Just HAVE FUN! They're easy.
