

The cost of the pattern, kit and materials are separate. We are focusing on 3 of Laura Heine's patterns. You may select one of the following Teeny Tiny (finishes at 16x 20) collages: The Flamingo. The Vintage Trailer, or The Truck. Kits are available for The Flamingo, but for the other two you will need to source your own fabric.

#### October 3 Workshop - Charming Hexagon Pillow

Workshop is from 10-4:00. The fee is \$40.00 and includes the pattern you need. LuAnn Krug will present this workshop which is a quilt as you go pillow done entirely by machine. You will need one mini charm pack or your own 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and 1" hexagon paper pieces. Instructions include how to complete the entire pillow including the envelope pillow backing. Class size is limited to 15. Location: Community Health Pavilion, 9669 E. 146<sup>th</sup> St., Noblesville.



#### October 15, 2019 - Paper Piecing Workshop – Presented by Mickey Depre Whirl Around Set-In Seams with The Whirligig Block

The workshop is on a Tuesday from 9:00-12:00 am at the Delaware Township Building on 131<sup>st</sup> St. in Fishers. Cost is \$20 for members and \$25 for non-members.

Mickey will walk us through all the tips and tricks to foundation piecing and then we will set that center square in, easy-peasy. Once you have one block under your belt, you will never hesitate to sew a set-in seam again.

This is a kitted workshop. The kit is \$10, payable to Mickey, the day of the workshop.



#### October 15, 2019 - Summer Carnival, a scrappy quilt block presented by Mickey Depre

The workshop is on a Tuesday from 1:00-5:00 pm at the Delaware Township Building on 131<sup>st</sup> St. in Fishers. **Cost: \$25.00.** 

Strips of fabric 1.5" and 2.5" wide are sewn, cut, and sewn again to make this fun block that is a twist on a traditional Sisters Choice block which fills the center of this quilt with a confetti-like appearance. This is a perfect workshop for developing your precision in piecing. Don't miss this opportunity to learn from a master!
