

Block of the Month

"Block of the Month" (BOM) is a quick and easy way to learn new piecing techniques while contributing to member quilts. Each month, the BOM Committee selects a unique block pattern which they assemble at home and bring to the guild meeting.

Everyone who wants to participate follows the same free pattern, using random fabrics with specified colorways. The following month, all the blocks are displayed, and a raffle is held to determine who gets to take the blocks home for an instant quilt. If enough members join in the fun, we might have 3-4 beneficiaries of the blocks.

Block Size: trim to 9" x 14.5"

Fabrics: 2 fat quarters (1 dark, 1 light) with good contrast. Use colorful prints of your choice. Pattern makes two blocks.

Information for Retreat Attendees

I am so looking forward to this retreat! I hope you are too! But I would be remiss if I did not talk about the Covid L9 virus. Our retreat is being held in LaGrange county. As many of you know this is a county with a large Amish population. The Amish in general do not believe in vaccines. I have contacted the Farmstead Inn, and at the present time no masks are being required. I have been checking the Covid 19 infection rate for that county. It is currently at a 7 day average of 4 cases per day, extremely low compared to Marion and Hamilton counties.

I know the entire conversation conceming Covid L9 tends to be very divisive. My intent is to keep everyone as safe and comfortable as can be. So first I am asking anyone who does not feel well prior to the retreat to either get a Covid test prior to coming or stay home. The guild will refund your entire retreat fee, not your room cost that is between you and the Farmstead Inn. Also, we will be asking each person attending the retreat to wear either a green, yellow, or red ribbon designating how comfortable she is with being near others. Green for huggers and red for those that would prefer others to keep their distance with yellow being for fist or elbow bumpers. And of course if you want to wear a mask you are welcome to do so.

Upon aniving at the Farmstead Inn please proceed to the front desk and get your room. You may either go check out your room first or bring your sewing machine and other sewing items to Conference rooms C,D,and E. There will be a table for check in. At that time we will ask you to pick up the colored ribbon of your choice and to fill out an emergency contact - just in case. The sewing room will be available for sewing at 3 PM. We will have pizza the first evening for everyone.

UPDATED PACKING LIST

Mudsocks Quilters Guild Circle of Friends Retreat

Items to bring for crafting:

- o Decorative Beads with a center opening big enough to slip over a thick skewer, avoid pony beads, they have too large an opening.
- o 3-4 fabric scraps at least 8"x16"
- o 1-2 Narrow ribbons to coordinate with your fabrics, at least 10" in length
- o Floss, Perle Cotton, twine, or other rope like fibers in colors to coordinate with your fabrics
- o Small fake leaves, pumpkin leaves would be ideal, or green felt to make your own leaves 6-8
- o Thin loft batting scrap pieces at least 8"x8"

If you have extra beads, ribbon, leaves or batting scraps you might bring along to share with others.

Snacks:

Please bring a snack to share, plus your favorite for yourself! Also, bring your own drinking cup or mug, preferably with a lid.

Here is a checklist of things you might want to bring along.

- o Sewing Machine and Accessories
- o Sewing machine and extension table if you use one.
- o Footpedal w/Power cord
- o Instruction manual for your machine
- o Extra sewing machine needles, various sizes
- o Small screw driver
- o Small cleaning brush
- o 1/4 foot
- o Walking foot
- o All-purpose foot
- o Surge protector Notions
- o Thread in neutral colors
- o Pre-wound bobins
- o Sewing scissors
- o Thread snips
- o Rotary cutter and extra blades
- o Cutting mat for your workstation if you want
- o Hand-sewing needles
- o Seam ripper
- o Pins and pincushion in a Ziploc bag
- o Safety pins

- o Pens, markers
- o Reading glasses
- o Band-aids
- o Pain reliever
- o Comfortable clothing don't forget a sweater or jacket . Comfy shoes or slippers
