

February 13th -- Mudsock Quilters Guild Meeting (9:30–11:30) Cornerstone Lutheran Church

Connie Lancaster, owner of **Quilts Plus.**, a fabulous shop in Lebanon, IN, made her first quilt in 1978, with the help of her mom. It was a giant LeMoyne Star quilt using forest green, rust, and cream calico prints. (You know those colors!) Since then, Connie has gone on to become a teacher and lecturer, workshop leader, pattern designer, longarm machine quilter and teacher, and shop owner. Her over 40 years of experience in all types of quilting have led her to becoming a modern quilt lover.

Her presentation, titled **Blue Ribbon Binding**, is the result of that experience. Having assisted with quilt judging and interviewed many quilt judges, she has learned what makes a ribbon winning binding and will show you how! From calculating, to cutting, to sewing, to hand finishing, you will learn the best techniques of proper binding. Becky and I had a sneak peek while at her shop and both agreed we had improvements to make in our quilt bindings. You may want to take some notes

She will be bringing a sampling of her shop to the guild meeting so you may shop during break and after the meeting. (Hint- Bring money, check, credit card... and buy your own Valentine's present).

While we do have some funds from the Hospital Auxiliary, remember to shop in the storeroom for your backs and batting. Our batting costs us \$4.99 per yard by purchasing in bulk from Accomplish Quilting, which is far cheaper than buying a small package at \$10 or \$12 per yard. We offer a table at each meeting to bring your items in that you no longer need or want. Everything should have a price, so you can find a "great deal". If there is no price, just pay what you think is a "steal of a price"! There will be a bucket to place your money. All proceeds from Steals N Deals go back into the guild.

If your item does not sell, please feel free to take it back home. If not, then I take everything and hold onto them for a later meeting or donate them to various organizations to help others.

When you bring in your items, we just ask that you have each item marked with a price. Fabric should be priced using the scale of \$4.00 per yard. Baggies work well for fabric pieces or scraps. If you are unsure of the pricing, please give it to me and I can price it or take it home and bring it back at the next meeting. It can be overwhelming sometimes.

We will continue with Steals N Deals at the monthly meetings. I will wait until I get a surplus of items or a big donation before I have a garage sale. I will always give you plentily of notice.

"**Block of the Month**" (BOM) is a quick and easy way to learn new piecing techniques while contributing to member quilts. Each month, the BOM Committee selects a unique block pattern which they assemble at home and bring to the meeting.

Everyone who wants to participate follows the same free pattern, using random fabrics with Specified colorways. The following month, all the blocks are displayed, and a raffle is help to determine who gets to take the blocks home for an instant quilt. If enough members join in the fun, we might have 3-4 beneficiaries of the blocks.
