

MUDSOCK QUILTERS, be sure to mark your calendar to attend our annual QUILT SHOW on **Saturday, November 11th, from 10 am to 3 pm**, at Cornerstone Lutheran Church, 13450 E.116th Street, Fishers, Indiana. Please plan to spend a little time to witness and appreciate all the beautiful work our guild members create. While at the show you can plan to shop at our **Steals and Deals** booth along with a few local vendors that will be set up in the lobby. Additionally, we plan to have a few items that will be RAFFLED off during the show. The RAFFLE tickets will only be sold during the Quilt Show and the winning tickets will be drawn the

day of the show. You need not be present to win. One last reminder is to bring cash or check in addition to your credit cards. Some of the vendors are unable to take credit.

As I turn my calendar to the month of September, I realize that the Mudsock Quilt Show is quickly approaching. During the summer months, our Committee has been busy Advertising, and signing up Vendors. Now that we are in the month of September our focus will expand to seeking volunteers to transport quilts, planning the day of our show, and signing up volunteers to set-up quilts and volunteers to work at the welcoming station areas. If you're interested in helping, catch Linda Westbrook at the Guild meeting on September 11th.

The show features nearly 300 quilts in the church sanctuary. At the door we ask for a donation of \$5 for adults who attend the show (no charge for children). All funds raised will be donated to the cost of material and quilting supplies. In addition to seeing the quilts during the show, we are signing up vendors who will be setting up in the lobby. By The Way ... be sure to bring any scissors or cutting implements that need to be sharpened. Bob Zickler from "Better Edges" plans to set-up his scissors and tool sharpening truck.

Louise (Lou) Cobb, advertising manager, has tirelessly reached out to quilt shops and quilt guilds to spread the word about our Quilt Show. Currently, Lou is out of town for a vacation with her family. If you need additional bookmarks to share and pass out, please contact Diane David and she will make them available to you. If you have any other questions on publicity and advertising while Lou is gone, just contact Val Bruemmer or Linda Westbrook. We still have open spots for local VENDORS or CRAFTERS that would like to sell their wares during our Quilt Show. If you or someone you know makes and sells handmade items and would like to join the Quilt Show, please reach out to Val Bruemmer, our vendor manager, at Mudsockshowadvertising@gmail.com or Linda Westbrook. There is no charge to our vendors, we only ask that an item be donated to our door prize items that will be given out during the show to the attendees. We will provide one table and a chair to our Vendors. If there is a need for more, they should plan to bring the additional items. For further details **contact Val Bruemmer or Linda Westbrook**. The vendors will be able to start setting up at 8:30 am on the day of the show.

Block of the Month

"Block of the Month" (BOM) is a quick and easy way to learn new piecing techniques while contributing to member quilts. Each month, the BOM Committee selects a unique block pattern which they assemble at home and bring to the meeting.

Everyone who wants to participate follows the same free pattern, using random fabrics with Specified colorways. The following month, all the blocks are displayed, and a raffle is held to determine who gets to take the blocks home for an instant quilt. If enough members join in the fun, we might have 3-4 beneficiaries of the blocks.
