

Block of the Month

"Block of the Month" (BOM) is a quick and easy way to learn new piecing techniques while contributing to member quilts. Each month, the BOM Committee selects a unique block pattern which they assemble at home and bring to the meeting. Everyone who wants to participate follows the same free pattern, using random fabrics with specified colorways. The following month, all the blocks are displayed, and a raffle is held to determine who gets to take the blocks home for an instant quilt. If enough members join in the fun, we might have 3-4 beneficiaries of the blocks.



We are determined to make this year's show BIGGER and BETTER than ever! This year you will have the opportunity to shop at several QUILT SHOP VENDORS for quilting supplies. In addition, we have various VERDORS selling their unique and homemade goods. These Artisan Vendors are offering everything from handmade Christmas ornaments, Christmas stockings made from vintage quilts to greeting cards and homemade toffee. In fact, we have a total of 14 VENDORS signed up for the show. Be ready to shop till you drop.

By The Way ... be sure to bring any scissors or cutting implements that need to be sharpened. Bob Zickler from "Better Edges" plans to set-up his scissors and tool sharpening truck.

Louise Cobb has done an amazing job of advertising our Quilt Show in all the possible ways she could come up with. However, we still have time to hand out more bookmark fliers. Keep up the good work.

Our QUILT SHOW is planned for Saturday, November 11th, from 10 am to 3 pm, at Cornerstone Lutheran Church, 13450 E. 116. Street, Fishers, Indiana. At the door, we ask for a \$5.00 donation for the adults who attend the show (no charge for children). Our quilt show is our opportunity to SHOWCASE all the amazing Quilts that our Mudsockers have created this past year. We will have over 300 quilts on display. We also have 20 door prizes to give out throughout the show. Be sure to drop your ticket in the door prize bucket as you pay your entrance donation (need not be present to receive a door prize).

In addition to the Quilts on display we will be selling tickets for 3 separate Raffle items. We owe a big THANK YOU to Heather Gumm for her gift of CatRobics quilt and Dianne David for her gift of the beautiful handcrafted Seasonal Baskets. Come to the October Mudsock meeting Monday, October 9^{th} to see a preview of the items to be raffled. Steals N Deals

We offer a table at each meeting to bring your items in that you no longer need or want. Everything should have a price, so you can find a "great deal". If there is no price, just pay what you think is a "steal of a price"! There will be a bucket to place your money. All proceeds from Steals N Deals go back into the guild. If your item does not sell, please feel free to take it home. If not, then I take everything and hold onto them for a later meeting or donate them to various organizations to help others.

When you bring in your items, we just ask that you have each item marked with a price. Fabric should be priced using the scale of \$4.00 per yard. Baggies work well for fabric pieces or scraps. If you are unsure of the pricing, please give it to me and I can price it or take it home and bring it back at the next meeting. It can be overwhelming sometimes.

We will continue with Steals N Deals at the monthly meetings. I will wait until I get a surplus of items or a big donation before I have a garage sale. I will always give you plentily of notice. As always, please ask me any questions, anytime. My email is mkdpm@yahoo.com.
