

I want to THANK all our Mudsock members for their generosity of time, the beautiful quilts that have been created, all the hard work, and willingness to tackle the tasks needed to make this Charity and Quilt Review happen. This year we had on display a total of 338 Quilts on the day of the show. We had a total of 15 vendors attending and set up to sell their wares at the show. We raised a total of \$1,565.00 from the 316 people who attended the Quilts on Display in the sanctuary.

"Block of the Month" (BOM) is a quick and easy way to learn new piecing techniques while contributing to member quilts. Each month, the BOM Committee selects a unique block pattern which they assemble at home and bring to the meeting. Everyone who wants to participate follows the same free pattern, using random fabrics with specified colorways. The following month, all the blocks are displayed, and a raffle is held to determine who gets to take the blocks home for an instant quilt. If enough members join in the fun, we might have 3-4 beneficiaries of the blocks.
