

Next year, the Guild will support six primary charities, donating quilts every other month to:

Quilters are invited to submit quilt entries to this non-juried show. All quilts and all skill levels are welcome! Quilts entered must have been made within the past five years. Entry deadline is February 9, 2026.

This year's challenge quilt theme is "Sing Me a Song." Create a quilt based on a favorite song – sew start singing your quilt song!

Block of the Month

There is no Block of the Month for December.

Looking ahead to 2026, Chris Behme will chair the Block of the Month program. We are excited to announce our theme: "A Year in Stars", celebrating the 250th Anniversary of our nation. Each month, members will receive a pattern for a 12" finished star block. Guild members are encouraged to make 1 to 5 blocks, which will be awarded at each meeting to 1 to 3 lucky winners, drawn from those who submit blocks that month.

This year we are adding another layer to the BOM patterns. On some months, you will be given an alternate size to use for blocks you create to keep for yourself. At the end of the year, we will provide instructions for assembling these various-sized blocks into a small quilt. If you prefer, you may instead make an extra 12" block each month to create your own sampler quilt.

The January block, which will be presented at the December Guild meeting, will be made as a donation to our Quilts of Valor Chapter. It's an easy block so we hope you make several for this worthy cause.

Be thinking about what color scheme you want to use for your 2026 Star sampler. Red, white and blue are the obvious colors, but you may want to use brights, pastels, or a monochromatic theme. The possibilities are endless. Yardage guides to be posted in December.
